Gichimu Githinji,MP have presented a legislative proposal before the national assembly to amend article 204 of the constitution of kenya through a parliamentary initiative in order to entrench the national government constituencies development fund(NGCDF), national affirmative action fund(NGAF), the senate oversight fund and the economic stimulus and empowerment fund in the constitution:</p> <p>Appreciating that the proposed amendment will contribute in the advancement of the principle of equity and the acceleration in the development of the republic as demonstrated by the impact of the recently annulled constituency development fund(CDF) funded projects and programs across kenya:</p> <p>Recognizing, that current realities show that budgeting and implementation of development proects at the county level tend to be biased leading to skewed distribution of resources resulting in underdevelopment of some wards within a particular county. That whereas,it has generally been accepted by majority of Kenyans that the creation and implementation of a county wards equitable development fund shall guarantee the fulfilment of the objectives of devolution espoused in article 174 and will in particular allow:-</p>	6/12/2022	Hon. 	<p>1) The promotion of equitable development across all wards in each county;</p> <p>2) The participation of residents of each county in the identification of priority projects in the county; and</p> <p>3) The promotion of decentralization of functions and provision of services by county governments to the extent that it is efficient and practicable pursuant to article 176 of the constitution.</p> <p>Noting that , efforts to create the county wards equitable development fund faced many hurdles including annulment of various legislations passed by various county assemblies and inability of the senate to pass a national legislation on county wards equitable development) fund due to constitutional challenges similar to those facing the recently annulled CDF; That whereas, the legislative proposal presented by hon Stephen mule, MP and the hon. Gichimu githinji, MP which aims to amend article 204 of the constitution provides a perfect opportunity to entrench the county wards equitable development fund alongside the other proposed equity funds in the constitution;</p> <p>That whereas, under the rules of procedure of parliament a bill to amend the constitution must be considered by both houses of parliament having realized the requisite constitutional thresholds, it is prudent that before the national assembly either considers or refers the proposed constitutional amendment bill to the senate, the proponents of the bill or the national assembly first incorporates the county wars equitable development fund in the proposed law;</p> <p>And whereas all the matter in respect of which this petition is raised are not pending before any court of law r constitutional body and earlier efforts by both the 47 county assemblies and the senate to establish the county wards equitable development fund by way of legislation have been unsuccessful for reasons stated herein;</p> <p>Now therefore, your humble petitioners pray that the national assembly intervenes and ensures;</p> <p>That the county wards equitable development fund be incorporated in the proposed constitutional amendment bill before the national assembly by the hon. Stephen mule MP and the Hon.
