Aware, that Friday 30th June 2023 was a very dark day for our county as there was a grisly accident that occurred at the Londiani junction which led to the death of 52 people comprising of 31 males, 18 females and 2 children:

Further aware that there were also other several casualties who were taken to Londiani Sub county Hospital, Kericho County referral hospital and other health facilities at Nakuru County;

Further Aware that following the grisly accident, the National Government and the County Government being led by His Excellency the Deputy President Honourable Rigathi Gachagua held a fundraising for the victims of the Londiani accident.

Cognizant that the fundraiser was held on 4th July 2023 and that it was a success as they were able to raise Kshs 13.6 million to assist the victims of the said accident.

Further Aware that the said funds were given to the county government to ensure that the said victims are compensated for their loss.

Further aware that there was a committee that was constituted and meetings held to identify the beneficiaries and determine the level of support to be given to the victims of the Londiani accident.

Concerned that Kericho County has been trending on various media platforms for the wrong reasons as a result of alleged misappropriation of the said funds;

Noting that it is the County Assembly's role to oversight the County Executive and represent the people of Kericho County including the affected families of the Londiani accident in ensuring proper utilization of funds raised;

I urge this Honorable House to resolve that;

- 2. The terms of reference of the committee is to report to this House upon investigation on:
 - i. The exact number of people who had passed on as a result of the Londiani accident and morgue charges per deceased person;
 - ii. The exact number of casualties as a result of the Londiani accident and the cost incurred per patient;
 - iii. The total amount of money raised at the fundraiser for the Londiani accident victims;
 - iv. The amount to be waived by the County Government of Kericho for the health services rendered to the said victims (both casualties and deceased);
 - v. Report on breakdown of how the funds raised was distributed to the casualties and the families of the deceased including their places of residence;
 - vi. Composition of committee (if any) formed for utilization and distribution of the said funds and terms of reference for the said committee;
 - vii. The no of vehicles used for facilitation to support the victims ,the departments they were drawn from and the fuel cost used per vehicle;
 - viii. The properties that were destroyed during the incident and how much was paid out from the fund as compensation; and
 - ix. Report on breakdown on utilization of the said funds for activities other than the compensation to the casualties and the families of the deceased.
- 3. The committee shall table a report of the said issues within 7 days from the date of passing this motion.
- The rules and procedures of the committees as stipulated in the Standing Orders equally applies to the Ad hoc Committee. (continuation of business interrupted on 1st August 2023 – Morning session)
